Updating your siding can also provide your home better protection from air getting out or water getting in. New siding ensures that there are no cracks or gaps in your home's exterior prohibiting leaks and costly water damage that can come from rain and snow. Additionally, new siding offers insulation opportunities that keep the air that you have paid to heat or cool comfortably inside.

Of course, the most obvious benefit of new siding is that it lets you customize your home's aesthetics, creating the curb appeal that you want. Giving your home a newly constructed look lets you choose colors, textures and styles that best express your design theme.

PICK YOUR SIDING MATERIAL

Vinyl: Vinyl siding has evolved since it first came onto the market and is now one of the most popular siding options. You have a wide range of choices; traditional horizontal clapboard or dutchlap siding, cedar shake that mimics the look of real cedar or even a decorative scalloped design. Hose it down once or twice a year to keep it looking spotless for years.

Stone veneer: Stone veneers, such as Versetta Stone, can give your home the look and color of stone without any

Applied to your home much the same as vinyl siding, Stone veneers, require no painting or sealing and can be used along with other siding options for a great-looking stone facade.

Fiberglass: Fiberglass is especially lightweight. This more recently introduced siding option differs from vinyl because it doesn't expand or contract seasonally making for a tight fit that many people are turning to. It's best known for protecting homes by keeping moisture out. Often selected for protection in extreme environments it is a durable siding option that doesn't fade and comes in an array of colors.

Composite siding: Composite siding options, such as Exteria, can provide the look of stone siding without the associated installation or maintenance headaches. These vinyl composite options are durable, easy to install and more affordable than stone, which can break down and require maintenance over time. **Other options:** If none of these choices suit your tastes, don't worry. There are a variety of other siding choices including fiber cement and wood. Talk to your designer about what will work for you and look best on your home.

Once you decide on new siding for your home, it's time to find the right company to install it and help you make the right decisions. As you conduct your research into finding the best company, keep these questions in mind:


How long has this company been in business? A company's track record can tell you a lot about what they'll be like to work with.
